INTERNATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL YOUTH CORPS (IEYC) PROGRAM

FAQ: What activities qualify as International Exposure?

To qualify for IEYC Funding, your full-time, permanent position is required to include some international exposure. These activities can vary greatly. Some examples include:

- Your company website receives traffic from countries outside Canada and/or includes content on globally significant issues such as greenhouse gas emissions, cross-border migratory species or endangered species.
- Your new hire will be mentored and or trained for eventual employment on future international projects
- Your new hire will contribute to international publications
- Your new hire will directly increase your company's capacity to perform international work (including developmental and /or research work on an international project from a Canadian office)
- Your new hire will gain experience as a liaison with international organizations or clients
- Your new hire will gain experience in the development, maintenance, and support of international markets
- Your new hire will gain experience on a project that focuses on a globally significant issue (i.e. greenhouse gas emissions, cross-border migratory species, endangered species)
- Your new hire will indirectly increase your company's capacity to perform international work (i.e. perform
 work on a domestic project for another employee who can then be reassigned to perform direct international
 work)
- Your new hire will travel outside of Canada during the course of the internship (i.e. attend international conferences and/or trade shows)
- Your new hire will work outside of Canada during the course of the internship (USA is considered international)
